Successful Spring Warehouse Sale

As this was a small sale, only fiction, mass market paperbacks, puzzles and children's books were available as well as a special section of cookbooks. Customers started lining up early and by the time we opened at 9 am, there were over 30 people waiting to snap up the bargains. The weather was great and sales were brisk, with a steady stream of shoppers throughout the day. Many families came to explore the Children's section, and the trays of books were constantly restocked to keep up with the demand.



Being able to restock was one advantage of having the sale in our warehouse. Another was being able to check the shelves on request for specific authors or titles, and the customers seemed to appreciate this personal service. During the five hours of the sale, we estimated we sold between 1,500—2,000 books. A very successful sale! Thank you to all our shoppers and volunteers. 


Book Recommendations from Your "Friends"



A great locked room mystery, that takes place on a private Greek island owned by a reclusive movie star and her celebrity friends.


Michaelidies delivers another thriller with an unreliable narrator that is a perfect read for the beach!

Recommended by Jeanne Hayes




