

The building will be of fireproof construction with an exterior of rough faced brick with cast stone trimmings. In the ground floor of the school will be built a cafeteria while on the first floors will be domestic science and manual training rooms. On the second floor will be class rooms and labrotories for the chemistry and physics departments.

The auditorium will have a gallery and will seat 700 people. It will have a stage, dressing rooms and other facilities for the staging of school func-

tions

The gymnasium will be completed in every detail. There will be separate locker rooms for boys and girls, large

gymnasium floor and showers.

Across Prospect Street, to one side of the proposed school, is located the city's playground and park which will be available to the students for recreational and athletic purposes.
