



## Friends—Volunteer Spotlight



Kathryn Genda's decision to spend a year volunteering between her Yale graduation and the start of three years of graduate studies has proven to be a very productive one for the Friends of the IBML. "Kat" has been a welcome addition to the volunteer corps, picking up book donations and cleaning and sorting books in the warehouse several days a week.

Originally from Chappaqua, NY, Kat is the middle daughter in a family that moved to Branford only three years ago. While in high school she participated in a mock trial club, which probably started an interest in becoming a lawyer. Known as "a detail oriented, opinionated, pernicious child" - she obviously has traits required to excel at lawyering!

A history major at Yale, she found herself in the unfortunate position of starting Freshman year in 2020, just as everything shut down due to Covid. Spending the first two weeks in a solitary room, having only Zoom classes, the future looked bleak.

Taking finals online and being tested for Covid constantly thru Junior year took stamina and a positive attitude.

Things looked up when she was selected to intern at the USDA's office in Washington DC and then spent a summer study program in Dubrovnik, Croatia. The program opened her eyes to her comfort level related to human suffering and the desire to find legal justice for underserved human beings.

During her upcoming law school studies starting this fall at George Washington University in DC, her major interest will be International Human Rights Law. (She already has a DC apartment and hopes to spend a year studying abroad).

As all the Genda family members are athletic - competing in basketball, soccer, and softball - and if the healing progress on a torn ACL allows, Kat is looking forward to joining a "Volo Team" in DC involving several sports: softball, kickball and bowling, as well as continuing her involvement in volunteer work.

We wish her well in pursuing a satisfying life balance which includes public service. We are so thankful that her love of reading led her to the Friends!
